It's All One Struggle

Our pay, pension, healthcare, collective bargaining and rights as workers depend on electing legislators who will fight for a fair state budget. Since budgets are a statement of our values, fighting for a fair state budget is one of the most important ways we can ensure equality for all workers regardless of race, gender, or class.

A People's Economic Recovery

By constantly adjusting the previous budget, the racial and economic inequities that have been built into the budget for decades remain. The biennial budget process should be driven by the needs of Connecticut's working class - not the rich - and by its social debt to society.

Bargaining for the Common Good

By expanding the scope of bargaining beyond wages and benefits, we can make our contracts a statement of our relationship between the essential services we provide and our communities. By engaging our community allies in the bargaining process, we are able to center racial justice in our demands, which will help improve conditions for all workers.

Injustices in State Government

The average black and brown state worker makes approximately \$10k/year less than the average white state worker. The SEBAC program calls for an inspector general and labor management teams to ensure equal opportunities for advancement are always made available to all workers.
